

Data Privacy Notice

1. Your personal data – what is it ?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulations (the "GDPR"). This notice applies to volunteers, those who belong to our churches and members of the public. This notice does not form part of any contract and may be updated from time to time.

2. Who are we ?

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) of The Collegiate Church of the Holy & Undivided Trinity, with All Saints' Luddington and St. Helen's Clifford Chambers is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

3. How do we process your personal data ?

The PCC complies with its obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To enable us to provide a voluntary service for the benefit of the public in a particular geographical area as specified in our constitution;
- To act as a church by praying for our parish and those who belong to our churches;
- To administer membership records;
- To fundraise and promote the interests of our church, its groups and our associated groups of Friends;
- To manage our employees and volunteers;
- To maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications);
- To inform you of news, events, activities and services running at our churches;
- To share your contact details with the Diocesan office so they can keep you informed about news in the diocese and events, activities and services that will be occurring in the diocese and in which you may be interested.

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data ?

We obtain your explicit consent so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about diocesan events.

We carry out processing only where :

- the processing relates only to members or former members (or those who have regular contact with us in connection with those purposes); and
- there is no disclosure to a third party without consent.

We process your data as a legitimate activity to enable us to act as a church and for our pastoral teams and volunteer rotas to operate throughout the parish. There is no disclosure to a third party without further consent.

We also process data as a legal requirement so that we can carry out our obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement;

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other members of the church in order to carry out a service to other church members or for purposes connected with the church. We will only share your data with third parties outside of the parish with your consent.

6. How long do we keep your personal data ?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance set out in the guide “Keep or Bin: Care of Your Parish Records” which is available from the Church of England website

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate; and parish registers (baptisms, marriages, funerals) permanently.

7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which the PCC holds about you;
- The right to request that the PCC corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request that your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for the PCC to retain such data;
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- The right to request that the PCC provides you (the data subject) with your personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability), (where applicable) [*This only applies where the processing is based on consent or is necessary for the performance of a contract with the data subject and in either case the data controller processes the data by automated means*].
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request that a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable) [*Only applies where processing is based on legitimate interests (or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority); direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics*]
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office.

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
