PARISH CENTRE NAME CONSULTATION The PCC are considering changing the name to "The Trinity Centre" and would like to hear your views. The reasons for the proposed change are that it makes the link with Holy Trinity Church clearer (whilst avoiding being mistaken for the church itself so that less tourists come in looking for a certain gravel!) and it means we can call all the services that happen there on a Sunday morning "Trinity Centre@10" (there are currently different names for different weeks). VISTOR EXPERIENCE SURVEY During the remainder of August and through September market researchers from Research Solution will be undertaking questionnaires with visitors to the church. This information will be valuable in enabling us to reflect on the visitor experience we provide as a church and the ministry of hospitality we offer. FUNDING FOR BORE HOLE IN KADUNA Request for help from our link Diocese in Kaduna, Nigeria. Two wells have collapsed, so a bore hole is needed. They have received some donations from Coventry Churches, but are still £1,300 short for the project, which is urgent as the dry season starts in October.
