RECRUITMENT UPDATE Following the withdrawal of two candidates and the unexpected unavailability of one further candidate for unforeseen family circumstances the interviews for the post of Director of Music on Friday 12th July were postponed.

The interviews have now been rescheduled for Friday 4th October with an appointment to take effect from 1st January 2020. This will allow an opportunity to re advertise the post and those originally shortlisted will be guaranteed an interview as their interviews were postponed.

It can now be confirmed that Rebecca Mills has been engaged to fulfil the role of Interim Director of Music. Our thanks and congratulations are due to Rebecca for stepping up to fill this role which is temporary and for a period to cover until a new appointee to full role of Director can take up the mantle.

Rebecca will take up post on 12th August and will be undertaking work with the Leadership Team to ensure that Music Lists and organists are ready for next term and that the administrative systems and safeguarding arrangements are reviewed, updated and in place for the choir's return in September.
