



Choral Evensong

Welcome to this service of Choral Evensong according to the Book of Common Prayer.

From the earliest times, Christians have gathered at regular hours during each day and night to respond to God's Word with praise on behalf of all creation and with intercession for the salvation of the world. In monastic communities this developed typically into eight occasions of prayer daily. When Thomas Cranmer sought to create a pattern of prayer that could be shared by clergy and laity alike, he wanted all people, not just the 'professionally religious' to follow a disciplined pattern of daily prayer. In the first English prayer book of 1549 he therefore adapted elements of the monastic services to create the two daily 'offices' of Mattins and Evensong. These were re-issued in 1662 as part of the Book of Common Prayer we use tonight.

The daily pattern of prayer based on the Cranmer's work continues each weekday in said Morning and Evening Prayer here at Holy Trinity. On Sundays, Choral Evensong marks this special day when Christians commemorate both the day of Christ's resurrection and the first day of creation. The choir sing for us an Anthem (and sometimes also an Introit), along with part of the Book of Psalms and settings of the canticles taken from Luke's gospel (the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis). As we listen to these ancient words set to beautiful music, we are drawn into the worship of God without having to be concerned with the sound of our own voice. Instead we are invited to share in the timeless worship of heaven, which as Christians we believe continues night and day whether we are aware of it or not.

A Personal Prayer of Preparation

O Holy Father, give us grace to praise thee not only with our lips, but also with our ears and minds; and grant that when our worship is ended we may continue to glorify thee in our lives, to the honour of Jesus Christ our Lord.
